A central California native, Johnson served six years in the Air Force. Following an honorable discharge, he relocated to North Dakota and attended Minot State University.

The organization's Williston location opened in 2014 and the name changed to Genesis in 2020. The process of renaming, that included a restructure of the organization's legal entity, is when Johnson was first introduced to Keith Olson and the ND SBDC.

The clothing store carries a range of popular clothing, footwear and accessory brands for men, women and children. The management and staff pride themselves on their customer service and strive to provide a great experience for each and every one of their shoppers.

"Our mission is to provide our customers with a comfortable, safe, social environment in which to purchase recreational sports equipment and apparel," says Johnson. "Our company's success is measured by our involvement and acceptance within the community."

The organization has been involved in the community and seen a level of success that now deems a new location necessary. In October 2021, ground was broken and construction began on their new 5500 square foot facility, slated to open in the spring of 2022. Johnson said he and his staff had been feeling "squished" and are excited for the new expanded location.
