

Massachusetts Small Business Development Center’s Government Sales Advisory Program, is sponsored by the University Of Massachusetts Amherst Isenberg School of Management.

Program staff Daniel Lilly and Sandra Ledbetter earned the recognition for having met all performance goals this past year, including number of unique clients served, number of advising cases, contract preparation hours — and the facilitation of over \$30 million in financing for clients, representing approximately 29% of total statewide financing secured in FY21.

Dan Lilly frequently participates in events that leverage his expertise with the Small Business Innovation Research program, including the “Exploring Innovation Coast-to-Coast” event last May held in collaboration with the SBA Houston District Office.

Sandra also supported the successful execution of the first ever Virtual Matchmaker event held last October in collaboration with the Office of Senator Elizabeth Warren.

The program supports small businesses with a wide range of targeted government marketing assistance, and provides assistance to high growth, innovative companies to submit winning proposals to obtain Federal research funding to commercialize their ideas.

WON Sports Inc. is an indoor/outdoor sports complex in Seekonk, MA offering rental space for year-round soccer, lacrosse, baseball, softball, field hockey, football, and other activities that hold tournaments, leagues, camps, and other special events.

Brian LaFauci, an Air Force Veteran of 12 years as part of the 143rd Airlift Wing in Quonset, RI —started a real estate company in 2006 with his partner Peter Lawrence, also an Army Veteran. In 2018, Brian and Peter purchased an existing indoor sports facility that underwent a million dollar renovation with assistance from the SBA and local resource partners.

The Veterans Business Outreach Center supported Brian’s initial business planning and development phase by providing guidance and direction. SCORE Mentors provided Brian with counseling to help prepare the business with solid financials before applying for growth capital and eventually receiving an SBA-guaranteed 7A loan in August of 2018. As an entrepreneur and lifelong learner, Brian continued expanding his network by joining the VETRN Streetwise MBA program as a participant and completed the program in December of 2020.

“I have always been a firm believer that the supports available to us as business owners are invaluable. They aid us in stepping outside of our daily ‘fog of war,’ said Won Sports President Brian LaFauci. “During COVID that never was more true and the SBA was instrumental in helping businesses like ours weather the storm. It is an honor to receive this recognition after what was a trying few years for every entrepreneur out there.”

ARCpoint Labs experienced tremendous growth in revenue and demand for their services throughout the pandemic. The company provides risk mitigation through pre-employment drug and alcohol testing, background screening, workplace drug policy assistance, corporate wellness programs, and COVID-19 testing solutions for employers.

Gauri Bhalakia is the Founder and President, who after starting her first business out of her basement, then selling multilingual children’s books across the country – formed her second company in 2015 to become a franchisee of ARCpoint Labs.

Bhalakia started the business with support from an SBA 7A loan. The small business received a PPP forgivable loan in May 2020 and an SBA EIDL in June of 2020. Gauri also participated in the SBA Emerging Leaders Program, Worcester cohort in 2019.

“We as a business feel very honored to first be nominated and then to receive this award. We believe that our success is due to the exceptional and personalized service we provide to local businesses, our close relationship with our partners and the commitment of our employees,” said Gauri Bhalakia, President of ARCpoint Labs, Southboro.

ARCpoint labs has grown revenue 112% (CAGR) since opening the Southboro office in 2016, with the number of employees doubling in 5 years. To meet the growing demand for the company’s services, Gauri opened her second location in March of this year at 324 Grove Street in Worcester.

Bisousweet Confections LLC demonstrated rapid growth in sales and net profit for four years straight. Founded out of Karen Collins’ home kitchen in 2005, Bisousweet is a gourmet wholesale bakery currently scaling and selling to small independent shops and large retail chains in 14 states across the country.

A self-taught pastry chef, Collins started the small business after a request by a local gourmet food shop asking her if she could make Passover desserts to sell in the store.

“Running this company has pushed me far beyond anything I ever thought I could, or would, do. Every day is a test of patience, optimism, and problem-solving,” said Founder and Owner Karen Collins. “Without question, the people most deserving of this recognition are my co-workers. The Bisousweet Team is my family. I want to do well and be better for them, because they have done, and continue to do, extraordinary things for me. This company is everything because of them.”

In 2010, Collins moved from her home kitchen into a 600 sq ft. commercial kitchen and hired her first employee. The company today employs 45 people and is expected to double in the next few years. Karen also supports several charitable causes such as the Pan MASS Challenge, Dana Farber and the Acton-Boxborough United Way. Collins also mentored female led business owners as part of the Cultivate Small Business program run by Commonwealth Kitchen and Santander Bank.

Collins has received two SBA loans through Cambridge Savings Bank, in addition to an EIDL for covid relief. Karen has also been a client of SCORE since 2018, who she shared has helped mentor her through an extraordinarily challenging time.

Devin Brown purchased the J&J Machine Company in 2014. The acquisition was financed with an SBA 7(a) loan and an SBA-backed line of credit. Prior to becoming a business owner, Devin held management positions at the Turner Construction Company, Ernst & Young, Bio-Rad, and Biogen.

Co-nominees include Mary-Ellen Odone, Director of Finance & HR; Ron Fournier, Director of Quality; and Michael Harrington, Sales & Operations Engineer.

The team at J&J Machine received invaluable counseling services from Jill Beresford, Senior Business Advisor at the Massachusetts Small Business Development Center. With assistance from the experienced mentors at the SBDC, J&J Machine developed and successfully executed a turnaround plan and was growing and profitable by 2018 – enabling the company to fully repay their SBA 7(a) loan by 2019.

“We are honored by this recognition.” said President and Owner Devin Brown, “and we are grateful to our employees, customers, vendors, and partners who help us to succeed. We are especially grateful for the guidance we received from the SBA and the Massachusetts SBDC.”

Kathleen Kelly, Webster Bank last year in 2021 closed \$20 million in SBA financing with a focus on women, veterans, minorities and the LGBTQ community.

“The Financial Services Champion of the Year award is presented annually to an economic development practitioner who goes above and beyond to serve the small business community,” said District Director Robert Nelson. “Kathleen Kelly has been a passionate and tireless mentor for small businesses, contributing both her SBA lending and financial expertise along with critical business acumen to ensure capital is accessible to all, including our most underserved entrepreneurs. Recognition as both the MA and New England Financial Services Champion is a significant testament to her commitment to supporting small businesses region wide.”

Kelly currently serves as a board member with Boston Local Development Corporation. She also works with technical assistance providers such as VETRN, Veterans Business Outreach Center and the Massachusetts Small Business Development Center.

“I am truly honored to be nominated and to receive this award for the state and region,” said Webster Bank Senior Vice President Kathleen Kelly. “There is a long list of people who help me be successful including the devoted SBA District office staff, who respond to all my calls despite the volume of calls coming at them and my MSBDC partners, my CDC partners, my SBA closing attorneys and the team at Webster bank - thank you.”

Kelly has also received recognition as Coleman’s SBA BDO Winner for 2019 and as the SBA MA Breakout 7(a) Lender of the Year Award for 2019.



DetraPel is an advanced materials company that manufactures protective coatings without any cancer-causing fluorochemicals. DetraPel offers revolutionary cleaners and disinfectants along with stain removers. All products are researched, developed, designed, manufactured, and distributed to retailers, industrial partners, and direct to consumers from DetraPel’s facility in Framingham, MA.

Appearing on season 9 of ABC’s Shark Tank in 2017, David Zamarin started DetraPel in his parent’s garage in 2013 at the age of 15. Due to Zamarin’s deep conviction that cancerous PFAS chemicals were unnecessary in the production of protective chemical coatings, David spent years developing a solution by conducting research and development at independent labs -- where David learned polymer chemistry while shadowing researchers at University of Pennsylvania. Zamarin graduated Magna Cum Laude from Babson College in 2019.

“There is no place for PFAS chemicals in American households,” said Founder & CEO David Zamarin. “That is why DetraPel places such an emphasis on removing these carcinogens commonly used in paper, food packaging, and textile products.”

After filming Shark Tank, Zamarin landed several contracts and the company leased its first 4,000 sq. ft. manufacturing facility in Holliston, MA. Shortly after settling in, DetraPel began outgrowing the space and soon needed to relocate operations to a Framingham facility in 2018. After less than two years, DetraPel outgrew their initial Framingham facility and moved into a new one.

DetraPel utilized Economic Injury Disaster Loan and Paycheck Protection Program covid relief funding to ensure business operations went uninterrupted.

U.S. Eco Products Corporation is a full service government contractor, logistics and fulfillment solutions provider certified as an 8A, HUBZone, Woman Owned (WOSB, EDWOSB, WBE) business, SDB, and AC/DBE. The company supplies cost-effective, sustainable products and services, including safety supplies, LED lighting, landscaping equipment, snow removal equipment, and other specialty supplies such as de-icing fluid for airplanes and runways.

Doreen Blades started U.S. Eco Products Corporation in 2009, initially supplying a green alternative to rock salt sold in retail stores and airports. The company began to grow their product line and services with the goal of helping clients in reducing harm to the environment.

Clients served by U.S. Eco Products Corporation include the General Services Administration, Architect of the Capital Office, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Federal Reserve Boston, and Logan International Airport.

In addition, U.S. Eco Products Corporation received outstanding feedback after supporting the 2021 Presidential Inauguration. The company provided emergency cleaning services daily and added sanitation services around The Capital complex to support a changing mission that helped deploy the National Guard. Doreen’s team worked diligently from January to March, managing projects, coordinating security, and delivering critical sanitation services that led to a successful event.

Blades has received several awards through the years including being named WEUSA Top WBE CEO in 2017; and WBENC WBE Star in 2016. Blades also completed the SBA Emerging Leaders program in 2016, reimagined now as T.H.R.I.V.E. (Train. Hope. Rise. Innovate. Venture. Elevate.). Blades has utilized services by MA Procurement Technical Assistance Center, MA Small Business Development Center, SCORE, and the Center for Women & Enterprise.

The Protectowire Company earned the recognition for growing exports to over 100 countries worldwide. International sales currently represent 60% of total company sales. Protectowire is a global supplier of linear heat detectors for “special hazard” fire detection, which are used to protect assets and facilities in a variety of industries. Examples include petrochemical storage, conveyor belts, tunnels, vehicle systems, cold storage warehouses, and electrical equipment.

Protectowire was founded by Gerald and Sarah Holmes who tested, patented, and trademarked their fire detection system in 1938. In the 1960s, the company was gradually transferred to the Sullivan family. President and CEO, Andrew Sullivan, currently leads the company, which has been proudly manufacturing products in Massachusetts for over 80 years.

Protectowire has multiple full-time staff dedicated to managing export operations who also work closely with federal and state agencies. The Massachusetts Export Center’s Director, Paula Murphy and Regional Director, Julia Dvorko have been especially helpful in assisting Protectowire in successfully navigating international markets.

Protectowire has received SBA’s State Trade Expansion Program (STEP) grants to defray the costs of exploring international markets. Protectowire utilized their grants to exhibit at the Intersec Dubai trade show in 2019, 2020, and 2022. Additionally, STEP grant funds were used to acquire a European product registration to grow regional sales.

Andrew Sullivan is active in the local business community as a member of the Pembroke Chamber of Commerce, where he volunteers his time and expertise to further educate other businesses on the benefits of international trade.

Greg Acerra, President of Fireking Baking Company earned top honors this year, demonstrating extraordinary staying power, growth in revenue, expansion of operations, and job creation. Based in Braintree, Fireking Baking Company opened in Hingham, MA over 25 years ago by providing baked goods to local restaurants.

Originally a retail and wholesale operation, Fireking's client base includes restaurants, event centers, function halls, universities, caterers, and supermarkets. Most notably, Fireking has been expanding its white labeled baked goods business nationwide.

Fireking was first approved for an SBA 504 in 2013 with the help of Barbara Arena at Granite State Development Corporation for the acquisition of the 101 Campanelli Drive location. This move quadrupled their space and increased operating efficiencies; Revenues also quadrupled, and profitability consistently improved. In 2018, Acerra then utilized the SBA 504 again to finance two projects, including the financing of additional equipment and leasehold improvements to the newly leased location at 185 Campanelli Drive.

"I am honored to be recognized as the SBA Business Person of the Year. I have been blessed to have some of the hardest working and dedicated employees in the business to whom this award truly recognizes," said Greg Acerra, President of Fireking Baking Company. "I would also like to thank Barbara Arena and her hard working team at Granite State Development, Bob Nelson and his staff at the SBA and Bob Terravecchia and his staff at Coastal Heritage Bank for having the confidence in my team – for without their support my business would never have had the opportunity to flourish."

In 2022, Fireking was approved for its' third SBA 504 loan, which will be used to purchase new equipment and create new product lines. The business currently has approximately 125 full-time employees and an additional 100 part-time temp workers.
