Opening her business with only \$800 and an idea, she has nurtured and grown her initial concept to a community fixture that grew sales to six figures, expanded to a new retail location with party and event space, along with a mobile unit that extends her reach. They started as a family business where everyone pitched in where needed. She now has 16 employees and provides youth employment and training opportunities to gain much needed life and business skills. Aside from her business accomplishments and acumen, Michelle is a tireless advocate for small businesses in her community and devotes countless hours and dollars to non-profit organizations that support women, youth and small business. She mentors other women and minority small business owners and never hesitates to share her expertise and support. She is a 9-year member of the Radcliff Small Business Alliance, serving as a board member. She belongs to the Hardin County Chamber, chair of the Hardin County Mastermind Group, board member of Girls United, and a founding member of Business Owners Simply Service.
