Hartzell continues to maintain its reputation today as a global leader in producing premium Walnut lumber and high-quality thick Oak lumber. Marketing globally for over 100 years to distribution operations and manufacturers, Hartzell Hardwoods has, over the past 10 years, exported to over 30 countries throughout Europe, Mexico, the Far East, and the Middle East. The Ohio Development of Development and the Ohio's SBDC Export Assistance Network are proud to have supported Hartzell's export success through IMAGE Grants, SBDC Export Advising, the Export Internship Program and International Market Support services.
